

Managing God's Gifts To Us

Message from the Treasurer

Believe it or not, our traditional stewardship season is right around the corner. In preparation for what's to come, here are some things to ponder. The Institute for Faith, Work & Economics believes the idea of biblical stewardship "is where the concepts of faith, work, and economics intersecf". Bill Peel at The High Calling wrote an essay entitled Leadership is Stewardship in which he suggested there are four important principles about biblical stewardship we must understand.

<u>The Principle of Ownership</u> - God owns everything, we are simply managers or administrators acting on his behalf.

The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it (Psalm 24).

The Principle of Responsibility - Although God gives us "all things richly to enjoy," nothing is ours. Nothing really belongs to us. God owns everything; we're responsible for how we treat it and what we do with it. While we complain about our rights here on earth, the Bible constantly asks, What about your responsibilities? Owners have rights: stewards have responsibilities.

The Principle of Accountability - A steward is one who manages the possessions of another. We are all stewards of the resources, abilities and opportunities that God has entrusted to our care. We will all give account to the rightful owner as to how well we managed the things he has entrusted to us.

The Principle of Reward - As Christians in the 21st century, we need to embrace this larger biblical view of stewardship, which goes beyond church budgets or building projects, though important; it connects everything we do with what God is doing in the world.

Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving (Colossians).

<u>Columbarium Repair</u>: The Columbarium repair project is now complete with the addition of a beautiful copper cap. This copper cap was added to preserve and to protect the columbarium wall and its contents from the elements and add beauty to the structure. This lovely repair could not have been completed without the work and effort of Charlie Easton. A memorial plaque will soon be added to the back of the wall, "To the Glory of God and in loving memory of Charlie and Rosemary Easton".
