

I get emotional every time I think about leaving. This has become home; my children have grown-up here. But at the same time, I so strongly believe in the power and freedom of self-awareness – where God allows us to see things; taking a hard look at the surroundings outside one's self, and perhaps attaining a big-picture view for our own personal assessment. In this case, I am confident my leaving will allow the Lord to create anew in this church and in me. I thank you and God for allowing me to see this. I want to thank those parishioners who have actively engaged the worship and community aspects of who we are called to be. Without your regular presence in church and the gifts of your time and talent, there would be no reason to gather on Sunday mornings or to do what we do in the name of Jesus.

Too often, we hear the old cliché, "What we need here in this church is more young people and young families". I heard it said recently, and I agree; it would be great to see. But the reality is, every church is struggling to get the younger generations to come – and no one can force another to do something that is not a priority in their life. Yes, efforts have been and should continue to be made. But, I will say this... I am thankful and so proud to have been a part of a church where we have regularly acquired new members, no matter their age or demographics – they come because we are a welcoming community and we have fun together. Where St. Stephen's needs to begin, is in the return of current members – this is my hope and prayer. To this end, I share the words of the Apostle Paul in his letter to Philemon.

"When I remember you in my prayers, I always thank my God because I hear of your love for all the saints and your faith toward the Lord Jesus. I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective when you perceive all the good that we may do for Christ. I have indeed received much joy and encouragement from your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you, my brother. For this reason, though I am bold enough in Christ to command you to do your duty, yet I would rather appeal to you on the basis of love." I love you all!

#### **Message from the Treasurer**

From the spiritual viewpoint, we approach the last guarter of every year experiencing the final weeks of 'Ordinary Time' in the church year and anticipating the season of *Advent* which leads us to Christmas. From the 'business of the church' viewpoint, we take stock of where we are in relation to our budget projections for the current year and how that will translate to the next year's budget and the upcoming stewardship kickoff! No doubt those gifts and methods are appreciated and efficient both for the giver and receiver. But as we approach the time when we will discern what we can give to support the life and ministry of St. Stephen's in 2020, let's all take a little time to reflect on the 'privilege' of our giving and how we might demonstrate that to those around us.



#### **Foyer Group Ministry**

#### A History & Purpose in Gathering

The English word Foyer is derived from foier, the French term for hearthside and projects an image of warmth and comfort. For untold generations it has been customary for Americans to welcome old friends, family members and newcomers into our homes by gathering at the central hearthside to celebrate special occasions,

to enjoy times of fellowship and share moments of camaraderie. In tune with this time-honored tradition of hospitality the Anglican Community has for many years encouraged the formation of small informal Parish gatherings called Foyer Groups; small, close-knit groups of parishioners sharing a common bond of Christian love and concern for one another. The idea originated at the Cathedral of St. Michael, in the Diocese of Coventry, England – born of the massive devastation inflicted at the height of the German Blitz on London and Coventry during World War II. During one of the many air raids conducted in 1940, the city's 14th century cathedral was completely destroyed as a result of the aerial bombardment. Rather than dwell on the violent loss of his beloved place of worship, the local Provost was inspired to found a ministry of reconciliation that he called the Community of the Cross and Nails. While sifting through the rubble of the cathedral, he gathered many of the old nails that had fallen among the ruins and was inspired to have them twisted together to form a cross. This cross of nails and the words "Father, Forgive" became the unifying symbol of the International Ministry of Reconciliation, a group of devout followers who believe that understanding between peoples, nations, and ideologies can come only when human beings meet and know each other as individuals. They truly live out the maxim "Let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me." In 1967, the staff of the Coventry Cathedral began meeting together in small informal groups as a means "to bridge the divisions which subtly separate us one from another"; as a result of the meetings they noticed a powerful bond forming among the staff members who joined what they came to call the Foyer Group. Two years later, the Foyer movement spread to the congregation of Coventry Cathedral and then beyond. In time, Foyer Groups began springing up in parishes all over Britain and in America. Today, many Episcopal churches throughout the United States have fover groups that promote fellowship amongst members and encourage the informal exchange of ideas, experiences and common problems within friendly home surroundings and in a Christian context. Foyer Groups are a fun and easy way for parishioners to gather together on a regular but informal basis for purely social reasons – to enjoy one another's company, to strengthen bonds of community, to meet new members and just to get to know other people who share a common interest in Grace but with whom we might not otherwise interact. They provide a means to develop new friendships and deepen old ones and are a way to make our sometimes-too-large-seeming parish feel smaller and warmer. There is no agenda or plan – just casual fellowship and a refreshing meal. Groups are made up of singles, couples, young people, retired folks, etc., in other words a cross section of the parish. Out of the meetings, friendships develop among people who might not have any other opportunity to meet and get to know each other. Newcomers are especially invited to join one of the groups at any time.
